## **Message from the Pastor –** Submitted by Pastor Tim Feaser

When I was 12 years old, my parents took me from our home in Indiana to San Diego, California where my father was completing a master's degree in astronomy and geology. For my part, I was mostly focused on going to Disneyland and seeing the Pacific Ocean. However, that summer proved to be hugely significant for my Christian Faith formation in my adult life! My father's degree program was aimed at schoolteachers who were all teaching science in either middle or high schools. As a result, there were lots of kids my age who were the children of those completing the graduate program. Given the nature of my dad's program and the fact that they were training teachers, his professors were eager to include all these children in many of the labs and field trips. So, I remember visiting Mt. Palomar Observatory late at night while the astronomers were conducting research by observing galaxies around us. I also remember helping my dad locate rocks in the desert of Joshua Tree National Park and finding specimens that were literally billions of years old. After that summer I had to translate all of the Bible stories that I heard into a new worldview. That summer I learned that with each new scientific discovery, God's creation became even more amazing.

After becoming a pastor, I always wanted to give young people in my congregations a similar experience. That is what confirmation should be! Between our two churches, I think we can actually combine forces and organize a confirmation program this year. Certain parts of this program are mandated by our denomination, such as the Creed, Ten Commandments, and the Lord's Prayer. There are other things that I think you should know about like how the Bible is put together and a little bit about Martin Luther. There are also practical needs such as Science and Religion, identifying religious cults, and developing a prayer life.

This is to say, if you know of any young folks who might benefit from a confirmation program, please let me know. I'd like to host a "day retreat" every couple of months at our lake house at Smith Mountain Lake. It will be partially fun, partially educational, and partially reflective. As young people prepare for high school and possibly college, I hope that this would help them grow into an adult faith. Blessings to everyone!

# **Message from the Pastor –** Submitted by Pastor Tim Feaser

Back in 1958, a young newly ordained Lutheran pastor, named Harley Swiggum was called to be Assistant Pastor for Education at the big Bethel Lutheran Church in Madison, Wisconsin. Starting right after his seminary graduation in June, his first task was to recruit teachers for the congregation's Sunday School. Many folks turned him down because they said, "we don't know anything about the Bible!"

So, Harley decided that there was a critical need to teach the Bible to adults. He ended up writing a comprehensive adult study on Biblical content. It was to be a two-year college level course with the first year on the Old Testament and the second year the New Testament. The course became known as the Bethel Series, and it transformed the whole congregation.

Several years ago, I attended a two-week seminar at Bethel Lutheran Church in which pastors were trained to teach the Bethel Series in their congregations. I'd like to introduce BLC to this exciting Bible Study which would begin sometime this fall. Are you interested in a weekly hour and a half course in which you will learn Biblical content? If you decide to participate, I promise that you will be able to hold your own with the Jehovah's Witnesses! In fact, you will know the Bible better than they do.
